Kanpur Ordnance Factory Begins Production of TEJAS MK-IA **Ejection Parachutes**

India's Ordnance Parachute Factory (OPF) in Kanpur has begun producing ejection parachutes for the TEJAS MK-IA fighter aircraft, marking a major step towards self-reliance in defence manufacturing. Designed by Defence Research and Development Organisation -Armament Research & Development Establishment, these indigenous parachutes ensure pilot safety during emergency ejections at speeds over 2,205 km/h and altitudes up to 50,000 feet. Priced at ₹8 lakhs each, half the cost of imported counterparts, they meet international safety standards while reducing dependence on Europe and the United States for critical defence equipment. OPF is now the first Asian facility to manufacture such advanced pilot parachutes.
